Editorial

There is no doubt that, for most of us, the months and years seem to be going past quicker and quicker. Already we are half-way through 2024 and it only seems to have just begun.

What does the half-way mark signify for Christians? Well, the Church year celebrates the start of the Trinity season from the end of May - which then stretches as far as Advent. The whole of the middle of the year! And the lectionary which suggests bible readings for each day mainly focuses on not the beginning of Jesus' life or the end but the teachings and miracles which he performed – his mission.

So, it could be a time for us to review where we are in our spiritual lives and think about how much more of Jesus' teachings and miracles could affect our daily lives going forward. If we already know the stories, we could reread them slowly and prayerfully to gain more from them. We could enter into the story in our minds and think about how we would have reacted had we been present. Suppose the characters were our close friends or a family member. Can we feel what it would be like to have been alive and around Jesus during his lifetime? Does it make the message more real?

Then we could bring the reading into the present time. If Jesus were here in his physical body, how would we receive him and his teachings. What would we think about the miracles he performed? Maybe we would try to explain them away. But what if we had been present and witnessed the changes in people who Jesus ministered to. Could we explain that away? Would we be inspired instead to tell others so that they could also know about the stories and learn from the teachings? Perhaps we would be able to embrace Jesus, his love, and his message more so that the inner radiance of God's love shining through us would attract more and more people to live Jesus' teachings in their lives.

Then there is the controversial point that Jesus said that we would be able to do as much and more than he did: "I tell you the truth, anyone who believes in me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to be with the Father" (John 14:12).

So, we need to note "anyone who believes in me". May this Trinity Sunday and beyond be a time when we go deeper: deeper into the Trinity first so that we gain a deeper belief and faith, then deeper into Jesus' teachings so that they become not just a story but a stronger part of our lives.

Then perhaps we will miss fewer miracles and see them all around us.

And in the words of Graham Kendrick, a favourite song of mine and apparently Princess Charlotte:

Shine, Jesus, shine, fill this land with the Father's glory

Blaze, Spirit, blaze set our hearts on fire

Flow, river, flow, flood the nations with grace and mercy

Send forth your word, Lord, and let there be light.

HAPPENINGS IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS . . .

The Rogation Service at the beginning of May included breakfast being served beforehand. The Rev'd Mark Ellis conducted the service, in the middle of which, with our regular organist Martin Emslie on guitar, we visited the allotments to appreciate all that was growing and everyone's hard work in preparing the ground. We were also accompanied by some very vocal songbirds which served to enhance the service.

We were visited by Tom Thacher, his wife and two friends from the States, as he is a descendant of the Rev'd Peter Thatcher who was the vicar at St Barnabas from 1574 to 1624. The chapel on the south side of the church is referred to as the Thacher Chapel because descendants of his donated a considerable sum of money to the church in the mid to late 20th century. The family are very proud of their links with St Barnabas and several members of the PCC joined the visitors for a cream tea in the Thacher Chapel. Apparently the 't' in the name was dropped at the time their ancestors emigrated to the United States.

Two or three areas of the Churchyard are, once again, not being mown and we are starting to see many wildflowers appearing that are beneficial to insects.

All the allotments are now occupied with a great deal of activity taking place as a wide variety of vegetables are planted out.

Report from the Queen Camel Parish Council:

May has seen two meetings, the Annual Village Meeting (AVM) on Friday 17 May and the Parish Council (PC) meeting on Monday 20 May. **The AVM** was very well attended and opened with some songs from the choir of Countess Gytha School. The villagers

enjoyed this entertainment to get the meeting going and send their thanks to the school and choir. The meeting progressed with reports from both schools based in the parish, the doctors' surgery, our representative on the Somerset Council and our MP; these were followed by reports from many village organisations and clubs. The theme from many of the speakers was of improving communications and finding more volunteers to help in all the many activities in the village. These are not new themes but they were well made again.

The approved plans for the new Play Area were unveiled at the AVM. It is expected that construction will begin in July for about a month. More details on this timing will be given when they are firmed up. The approach by Green Lane to the playing field, the state of parking and the surrounds of the Play Area were raised as needing improvement. The PC is fully aware of these matters and plans to deal with them once the Play Area is completed. (Subsequent to the PC meeting I was delighted to see on Tuesday 21 May morning that Green Lane has been largely resurfaced — clearly the pressure that the PC, with the support of Cllr Henry Hobhouse, has put on Somerset Highways has paid off.)

The PC meeting was also its annual meeting. John Brendon and Phil Jones were elected as chairman and vice chairman respectively. Many other responsibilities as well as committee and working group roles were confirmed. These will be set out on the PC website.

In the main business of the meeting the PC considered again the state of our roads and of Blackwell Road and Sutton Montis Road specifically. The causes of the problems are different for both, but the PC agreed to keep up regular pressure on the agencies that have responsibility to try and achieve solutions. Similar pressure will be maintained on the related issues ranging from drains and gullies to the speed of traffic through the village to the volume of HGVs. It was also noted that new planters have been bought for the triangle by the church, but will not be put in position until the resurfacing required there is adequate.

The PC approved its annual governance statement and the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2024. These will be available for public scrutiny from 3 June to 12 July.


West Camel: Thursdays at 10.00am The walks run fortnightly - June 13th & 27th Meeting point: Davis Hall



Dr Frances Burroughs gave an interesting insight into life during WW2 for his mother Edith Booth who had trained as a florist in Manchester but, as war loomed, learned First Aid in chemical warfare and for treating air raid casualties. She joined the Voluntary Aid detachment in 1934 alongside 38,000 others.

She was called up as an army nurse in 1939 and was posted all over the country, keeping a daily diary that her son treasures today.

Edith spoke German, albeit with a Yorkshire accent, and in1945 was sent to Bavaria with
 an American attachment to treat survivors in Dachau. It was a gruelling time but she never
 spoke of those experiences.

After returning home she and her husband ran a nursery in Yeovil, she became a florist once more, and bred Cavalier spaniels. An enjoyable but poignant talk.

A Cake for the Gestapo is a novel written by a local author, Jacqueline King. Given the increased risk of flooding we seem to have experienced this year, we have commissioned a company to work on flood resilience to the Victorian building which will begin soon. Our plan is to implement similar measures to the rest of the site.



The service recently had an independent internal review and was graded as Outstanding; and was shortlisted to the final 3 in the Frontline National Award 2024 'Team of the Year'

Route1 helps children have happy childhood memories, and ensures their views are listened to and acted upon.

- Independent Visitors: These volunteers make a long term commitment to one child in care.
 They visit the child once or twice each month to build a trusting, supportive relationship and
 friendship that can sometimes last many years. This can bring life-changing experiences
 and opportunities to a the child or young person and their Independent Visitor!
- Advocates: volunteers work alongside individual children to ensure their voices are heard, and their wishes and feelings are taken into account when decisions are being made which affect them. Each child's support is usually short term and there is no expectation of a long term commitment to any particular child.

A recent trainee volunteer said "I started out thinking 'what on earth can require 5 days of training?' I now know why and think you have it just right."

Your life experience will be highly valued and you will be trained and supported in developing key skills. Your volunteering can be arranged to suit your availability.
